

Sexual Violence FACTS

Definition

Sexual violence refers to unwanted or coercive sexual behavior from sexual bullying to rape. The terms rape, sexual assault and sexual abuse are often used interchangeably and refer to coercive forced sexual contact. Remember: Sexual Violence is never the victim's fault. Any person, regardless of race, gender or sexuality, can be a victim of sexual violence.

Statistics

- 45% of women experience contact sexual violence in their lifetime.¹
- 16% of men experience contact sexual violence in their lifetime.¹
- 1 in 3 women experience sexual harassment at work¹
- 1 in 4 women experience technology-facilitated sexual violence¹
- 77% of rapists were known by the survivor.²
- On average more than 20,000 sexual violence survivors seek assistance each year from Illinois rape crisis centers.³
